

Classic Radio 1 Schedules (1967-2004)

October 1967

In the early years, Radio 1 was very different. It was originally conceived as a general popular music network, broadcasting easy listening, jazz, folk and country as well as pop and rock music. The intention was that it would opt out of the Light Programme with music when the Light was carrying a speech programme. This was largely the pattern in the first few years, with a lot of sharing between Radios 1 and 2, though the two stations did carry separate music programmes at breakfast and late afternoon. The daytime schedules didn't fully separate until the 1970s. Another feature of the early schedule is that many programmes featured different presenters on different days or in different weeks. A lot of the presenters floated between several shows.

April 1970

In 1970, the BBC re-formatted the four national networks. Radio 4 became mostly a talk station, whilst Radio 3 broadcast mostly music. Radio 2 became more music based and took over Saturday afternoon sport. Radio 1 focused on pop and rock music, dropping the easy listening and jazz. As a result, Family Favourites, Late Night Extra, Night Ride and the Sunday night jazz shows changed from being Radio 1 to Radio 2 programmes, even though they continued to be broadcast on both networks. On weekdays, the daytime sharing between Radios 1 and 2 was reduced and a new strand of rock and progressive music programmes was launched under the Sounds of the Seventies banner.

October 1971

From the Autumn of 1971, Sounds of The Seventies moved to late evenings and was relayed on Radio 2 FM. This marked the start of Radio 1 borrowing Radio 2's FM network for a few programmes a week in addition to those simulcast on Radio 2's AM network. This continued until 1990.

January 1975

At the start of 1975, the BBC ran into financial difficulties and had to make major programme cuts. Radio 1 lost its late evening slots, moving some of the rock and progressive music shows to 5 PM and axing others. Stuart Henry, Bob Harris, Alan Black and Paul Burnett left. Radio 2 closed earlier and started later and relayed Radio 1 on weekday afternoons.

January 1994

At the end of 1993 under new controller, Matthew Bannister, Radio 1 made its most radical changes ever. Older presenters were sacked or resigned and a host of new specialist programmes were introduced to target a younger audience. The changes took place in two steps, with evening and weekend programmes changing in November 1993 and the remaining programmes changing at the start of 1994. Only the Top40, Evening Session, Pete Tong and Bruno Brookes retained their old slots.
