How to obtain references

Books

The main sources of navigation books are the publisher's website (i.e. www.artechhouse.com), Amazon, and Navtech GPS (www.navtechgps.com).

Navigation: Journal of the Institute of Navigation and ION conference papers

These papers may be downloaded from the ION website (www.ion.org). ION membership is inexpensive and includes 12 free downloads per year and a 50% discount on additional downloads. There is also an option to purchase an unlimited downloads facility and to buy complete ION conference proceedings on CD.

Journal of Navigation

Papers may be downloaded from the Cambridge University Press website. Members of the Royal Institute of Navigation (RIN) may download papers for free via the RIN website (www.rin.org.uk).

*Please note that *Navigation: Journal of the Institute of Navigation* and *Journal of Navigation* are separate journals.*

GPS Solutions

Papers may be downloaded from the Springer website. Most institutions have an online subscription to Springer's online journals.

IEEE papers

Most institutions have an online subscription to the IEEE, providing free unlimited downloads to staff. IET (formerly IEE) papers are also available via IEEE.

GPS World, Inside GNSS and Coordinates

Most articles published in these magazines may be viewed and printed for free at the magazine's website, i.e. www.gpsworld.com, www.insidegnss.com.

Other publications

Online subscriptions to other journals and conference proceedings tend to vary from institution to institution. However, most libraries can access any paper for a suitable fee. An alternative is to email the author. Virtually all academics publish their direct contact details on the web. Businesses and government organizations tend not to publish employee contact details, but email addresses of high-profile authors are often available elsewhere on the web.
